

## Dimensioning Notes

### Dimension Lines

1. Dimension lines are thin, black, solid lines that show where a dimension begins and ends
2. Draw them parallel to the surface or edge being described.
3. Break the dimension line to allow room for the number to be written.

### Extension Lines

1. Extension lines are used to extend the lines on a view to show where dimension lines start and end.
2. Place them outside the view beginning about 1/16th inch away from the view
3. Make sure it doesn't touch the object, unless it's a circle.

### Arrow Heads

1. Arrowheads show the beginning and end of a dimension line.
2. Start drawing the arrow at the extension line, close to the dimension line.

### Leader

1. Leaders are thin lines used to direct dimensions, notes, or symbols to the intended place on a drawing.
2. Use an arrowhead at the end of a leader.
3. If a leader points to a surface, use a dot instead of an arrowhead.
