Overview

Probably one of the most difficult aspects of creating a page layout for the yearbook is coming up with your own original ideas. The next step is to translate your ideas into a visual presentation, the challenge of which is to unify your ideas so your layout looks and feels cohesive. Completing the planning sheet is an exercise which requires a lot of thought, hence, it will be evaluated in the Thinking category.

Requirements

If you are working on a single page spread (sps) by yourself

• Complete the single page spread (sps) planning sheet

If you are working on a double page spread (dps) with a partner **

- Each person completes *his or her own planning sheet*. (Two people, two planning sheets.)
- Use the double page spread (dps) planning sheet. Complete all the answers on page one
- Complete 2 of the 4 thumbnail sketches and their respective discussion of Emphasis and Subordination
- ** Please note that this planning sheet is *only single weighted*.

If you are working on a double page spread (dps) by yourself **

- Complete the double page spread (dps) planning sheet
- ** Please note that this planning sheet is *double weighted*, that is, twice that of a sps planning sheet.

Valid Planning Sheets

Planning sheets are only valid provided that you complete that particular page in your portfolio. If you change your idea for a page, you must create another planning sheet and the previous one is void.
