Submission Procedure (Part A):

Important: All files must be compatible with the software that is used at the school, Adobe CS3.

To submit your exam you must put your finished PhotoShop file in a folder named “yearbook summative”. You are to only have one file in that folder, the PhotoShop file and any Illustrator files that you may have used..

Put the “yearbook summative” in the root directory of your user drive. **Do not put it in subfolders.**

You must submit the PhotoShop file of your single page spread or double page spread in its layered form.

Submission Procedure (Part B):

You must submit your work in printed form, either hand written or word processed. You must find a lab to print your work if the printer in room 135B isn't working. You must submit it directly to the teacher, and you will put your signature on a sign sheet when you do so.

The Scope (Part A - 75%)

Using all skills you have acquired during this course and previous art or technology courses, produce a theme related double page spread. This primary purpose of this exam is to account for your skills. This is an individual assessment of your skills, therefore, you may not work with a partner.

The Scope (Part B - 25%)

You will do a design analysis based on your layout.
